
**We Must Inspire To Lead; Avoid
Becoming Some “Other Party”**

THIS MONTH'S MEETING

Speaker for this month's luncheon at **12 noon** on **Tuesday, June 3** at the Clarion Hotel on E. 70th Street will be **Louisiana Commissioner of Insurance, Jim Donelon**.

Prior to becoming Commissioner of Insurance, Jim Donelon served the Louisiana Department of Insurance in leadership positions as Chief Deputy Commissioner and Executive Counsel.

Jim is a native New Orleanian, graduate of Jesuit High School, the University of New Orleans and Loyola School of Law. Jim's public service career includes 33 years of



military experience in the Louisiana Army National Guard where he retired with the rank of Colonel. He was first elected to office in 1975 as Chairman of the Jefferson Parish Council and then served in the House of Representatives from 1981-2001 where he served as Chairman of the Committee on Insurance.

In 2001 Jim joined the staff of the Department of Insurance and was appointed Commissioner of Insurance in February 2006. He was elected to fill the unexpired term later that year and was re-elected in 2007 and again in 2011.

Jim serves on the National Association of Insurance Commissioners' (NAIC) Executive Committee as Immediate Past President and also serves as Chairman of the Surplus Lines Task Force. He is also on the Board of Directors of the National Alliance for the Mentally Ill in New Orleans.

FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Fellow Republicans,



People of all ages are becoming less engaged with the political process. There are ample reasons why folks don't feel "inspired" by our politicians. In fact, 1 in 5 Americans don't trust either the Democrats or Republicans. There is such broad dissatisfaction with both parties in Congress, in fact, that nearly 7 out of 10 Americans say they are inclined to look around for someone new this fall to send to Washington.

The number of voters registering as "other party" is increasing – now 1 out of every 4 registered voters. And even though Republicans are winning major state elections here at home, *The Advocate* also reported recently that voters "registered as 'other party' or not registered with any political party, are climbing too, as voters distance themselves from either of the mainstream political parties".

I believe the migration trend of some voters to "other party" can be explained very simply: voters are not inspired. And this was the subject of our roundtable discussion at the April Caddo Republican luncheon. Thanks to all who participated last month, as we worked to answer the question of how best to inspire others to follow us, as Republicans.

You see, voters increasingly are less and less inspired to follow any political party, it seems. In his book, *Start with Why*, author Simon Sinek explains that people don't buy "what" you do, but they buy "why" you do it. For example, how many voters know "why" the Republican Party exists? Or "why" the Party should matter to anyone? The answer may be fuzzy at first, but that's the rub in all of this. You see, once a political party, or any organization for that

matter, clearly communicates their "why" (their purpose, their cause, their belief), then (and only then) can they inspire others to follow. Our state is served well by individuals who get involved in party politics, and don't merely check off a box on their voter registration card. These are the volunteers that are the lifeblood to our democratic process.

They are the ones walking the neighborhoods, calling supporters, and who spend countless hours organizing party events, speakers, luncheons, and rallies. They do it because they believe the political process is meaningful and that their work makes a difference...they do it because they are inspired.

Right now we need a great deal of inspiration, from every one of you reading this right now, to get voters involved this election year, in the very democratic process that has nourished our republic now for almost 238 years – before we lose an entire generation to some "other party".

VOTE TO GROW

As Shreveport voters consider who will be their next mayor, and as the issues are debated, there seems no greater "elephant" in the room than our declining population. Elliott Stonecipher recently reported that Shreveport's population remains stagnate after three-plus decades. With July 1, 2013 population of 200,327 - down -1,739, or -0.9%, compared to one year earlier - Shreveport's population is now 5,493 below its 1980 Census count, 205,820. By contrast, three of the nation's five fastest-growing cities are right next door, in Texas. Along with our highest property taxes in the state, there very well may not be a more pressing issue to consider when electing our next mayor.

FOSTER FACES FOE FOR PSC

Public Service Commissioner (PSC) and notorious liberal Foster Campbell will be challenged for his District 5 seat this fall by Keith Gates, the current City Prosecutor in Winnfield and former Louisiana Supreme Court clerk.

Gates said he decided to run against Campbell because the people of Louisiana deserve "less bull." Gates also said that Campbell spends entirely too much time on the PSC focusing on energy efficiency and phone regulations for jails.

"We here in North Louisiana have watched as our commissioner, at the behest of Obama allied green energy

groups from Washington, D.C., have allowed utility companies to charge us extra fees in order that the companies may then give those fees to whoever they please to study energy efficiency," said Gates.

"While our commissioner concentrates on helping the jailbirds and the green energy groups, our utility service is still unreliable and our rates are still high. That's bull."
