





Louisiana Attorney General's Race: Shaping Up To Be A GOP Elephant Stomp

THIS MONTH'S MEETING

Speaker for this month's luncheon at **12 noon on Tuesday, June 2, 2015** at the Wyndham Garden Hotel (formerly the Clarion Hotel) on E. 70th Street will be **former Congressman, and now candidate for Louisiana Attorney General, Jeff Landry**, who is in a race against fellow Republicans Buddy Caldwell and Marty Maley.

Jeff is a successful attorney, a former lawmaker who fought for Louisiana's conservative values in Congress, a veteran, a former Sheriff's Deputy and local policeman, a father, a husband, and a small businessman. "Louisiana's next Attorney General not only needs to operate the office in a fiscally responsible and professional manner, but our next Attorney General also needs to be an advocate for the citizens of Louisiana," said Jeff Landry. "Time and time again, we are seeing major public policy decisions driven into our

courts both with expensive mandates from Washington bureaucrats to other issues here at home." he added.

Landry has noted the need for change in the Attorney General's office. Landry has written several op-ed pieces regarding the small number of law firms seeking to profit at the expense of jobs and economic growth in the state by using contingency fee contracts approved by the AG.



Landry's campaign has approximately \$1.3 million in the bank, and endorsements from Congressman Fleming and former U.S. Senator Rick Santorum. This race is just getting started, so don't miss this one.

Dear Fellow Republicans,



Are you ever so frustrated, observing what is going on in our government, and the increasing number of folks who are seemingly uninterested in the consequences of what is going on, that you just want to shout from the rooftops, "Wake up!" Well, I sure do.

Right now, we have terrorists taking control of cities in Iraq and controlling 50 percent of Syria. Iran is moving ever closer to nuclear capability, and North Korea is building a nuclear arsenal, while testing long-range missiles that could strike the U.S. mainland. Russia has flexed its military muscle, and invaded the Republic of Georgia and Ukraine. China is modernizing its weapons with fighter jets, developing prototypes for hypersonic missiles and building ballistic missile submarines. THE PROVERBIAL END FOR 3132?

There were additional meeting in May, held by the Northwest Louisiana Council of Governments (NLCOG), along with the Louisiana Department of Transportation & Development, regarding the extension of 3132 from Flournoy Lucas Road to the Port. Elliott Stonecipher reports that "there is a good chance that a 'No Build,' the only study outcome which fully protects Esplanade, may be the result of this Stage 1 Study. Two additional meetings from and by NLCOG will occur between now and a decision, supposedly early next year." Stonecipher is the spokesperson for the Finish 3132 Coalition, which has been party to two lawsuits involving 3132, and has alleged that government entities, as well as key public officials, short-circuited that route-selection process as developers encroached on possible corridors. The seven-step process to build a Louisiana highway takes more than 10 years, and considering it's been nearly 20 years since voters supported the bond initiative to extend 3132 to the Port, this seemingly is another example of why Ronald Reagan said that "the nine most terrifying words in the English language are, 'I'm from the government and I'm here to help'."
