
Showdown at the Schoolhouse: May 2 Have You Done Your Homework?

THIS MONTH'S MEETING

Speaker for this month's luncheon at **12 noon on Tuesday, May 5, 2015** at the Wyndam Garden Hotel (formerly the Clarion Hotel) on E. 70th Street will be **Caddo Registrar of Voters, Ernie Roberson**. Roberson has been Registrar of Voters for Caddo Parish since 1990.

Ernie is Louisiana's first nationally certified Registrar of Voters. Fewer than one percent of all election administrators in America have obtained national certification. Ernie is the only Registrar of Voters from the "deep south" selected to serve on two national task forces on elections in 2001 and 2005. The task force was comprised wholly of election administrators from throughout the U.S. The Help America Vote Act passed in 2002 and used the recommendations of this national task force, and specifically used two Louisiana election practices for a model nationwide.

He has also chaired numerous committees for the Registrar of Voters Association, including the committee that recommended to the Legislature the most stringent standards for Louisiana registrars to become certified election administrators. At the time of its adoption, it was the only such program in the country. Did you know that Caddo Parish is the only parish in Louisiana to utilize community groups to aid the Registrar's office on election day or to help voters locate their correct polling place through internet access. It's true. The "Where Do I Vote?" program first started in Caddo Parish in 2006.



In an environment of declining voter participation, you'll want to be sure and join us on May 5.

FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Fellow Republicans,



The dictionary is of no real help when looking to define “public servant”. Jesus Christ was a public servant and it was through humility, personal sacrifice, taking risks, and maintaining a vision, that he served others best. It’s a style of leadership based on giving without the need for recognition. And it may be disappearing altogether.

Consider the service of Judge Charles Scott to our community since 1973. His passing last month is a devastating one for our community, and there are hardly any words that can express this sadness for the generations of this community he has served.

It is fitting, to call to mind the saying, “They don’t make men like him anymore”. And they don’t. In fact, a recent study of 18-29 year olds by Harvard University showed not only are young people disgusted with politics, and are skeptical of its usefulness to make meaningful change, there is also now a reluctance of good candidates to run for public office.

This is especially prevalent among young people, where only 1 out of 3 believe running for public office is honorable, and even fewer feel that the idea of working in some form of public service is appealing to them – and the numbers show it. In 2012, for example, nearly half of state legislative districts in our country did not have any competition from both major political parties, marking the lowest level of competition in over 10 years.

So, from where will the next generation of public servants be inspired to serve our communities, when only 1 in 3 believe running for public office is honorable? That’s hard to say because our electorate increasingly is more interested in whether Kim Kardashian and Kanye West flew coach

on a recent trip to Armenia, than they are to learn more about politics.

In order for our communities to attract the brightest talent to public service, we must have a more informed electorate. Fewer engaged voters will eventually reduce the pool of talented candidates to a handful of those barely worth keeping in office at all.

While it may be true that how any one of us votes may not matter much, it is how WE vote together, though, that has consequences. Our votes can encourage businesses to relocate to our community, or cause them to leave, through the taxes we vote for or the quality of candidates we elect. We can improve the education of our children, and increase the quality of our workforce, or we can spend millions of dollars on policies and programs that will do anything but that.

No, they may not be making men or women exactly like Judge Scott any longer, but we can grow folks more like him to serve the public as he did, through developing a more informed electorate – or, through our apathy, we can simply watch more good men and women run from office, instead.

TAXES TAKE THE WEEKEND

One of the bigger issues on the ballot in the May 2 election is the \$108 million dollar bond proposal. Officials say voting yes and approving the bond would move the district forward, but not everyone agrees. The money will not go towards teacher salaries, curriculum or training. The funds will go to close 6 schools, build 3 new ones, and update the infrastructure of others. Opponents say that the school district is merely doubling the debt of the school system, even as the system experiences declining enrollment. Also on the ballot is the Biomedical Research Institute tax renewal. This tax is not new, but an existing property tax. It would renew for 15 years beginning in 2018 and ending in 2032, generating approximately \$3 million each year.
