A Messy Accident

Shell-shocked. That what it felt like, when it happened. It was like being rear-ended along busy and bustling Youree Drive traffic, and then suddenly being thrust forward as your neck snaps back, and then forward, from the impact. Your vehicle's rear-end is smashed into oblivion, and you are pretty sure you'll need to see a doctor, and as soon as possible. But when you step out your

vehicle, the other driver (who rear-ended you) gets out too, shouting out, and waving to you, "Sorry about that," as he backs up and drives off, leaving you to deal with the aftermath left in his wake.

There was no, "Oh my goodness," or "I'll make it right," from him. Nothing. No contrition. No accountability.

Well, that's what it was like when President Obama "apologized" last week for the millions of Americans losing their health insurance coverage because of Obamacare. He said, "I am sorry that they are finding themselves in this situation based on assurances they got from me."

That's it? Really? That's what you are going with?

4.2 million Americans have already lost their health insurance, and by the end of this year, that number is estimated to grow to 156 million – more than half the population – while almost 80 percent of people in the individual market will lose their policies, and that's all the President has to say? Who is going to repair this mess?

Author John C. Maxwell once wrote, "A man must be big enough to admit his mistakes, smart enough to profit from them, and strong enough to correct them." Well, the President's "apology" last week lacks any evidence whatsoever of any of those virtues.

Instead, his apology smacks more of Napoleon Bonaparte, who said, "In politics...never retreat, never retract...never admit a mistake."

You see, an apology is the simplest of acts; an expression of genuine regret to another for having harmed them in some way. But you first have to admit the mistake, and not simply deepen the chasm by convincing yourself, and everybody else around you, that it's important to stubbornly stay the "course". As many might humorously say here, "Denial ain't just a river in Egypt."

No, it takes confidence to truly admit to your mistakes and learn from them. Without confidence, you will end up defending things you do wrong, and never allow yourself the opportunity to grow and get better at whatever you do.

But what seals the deal is a commitment to changing, and it must be simple, feasible and specific. Obama's apology could have delayed by one year the penalty facing Americans who do not

enroll in insurance plans in 2014, because of all the technical glitches and other controversies. But it didn't.

The President's apology could have included a delay for the individual mandate, just as businesses were given more a time to comply with Obamacare. But it didn't. In fact, his Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius said "delay is not an option".

And so now, even Democrats, like Mary Landrieu, are speaking out to support Americans keeping their insurance plans, if they are happy with the ones they have. Nevermind, of course, that in 2009 Landrieu extolled the same principle, as she voted in support of Obamacare. And nevermind, of course, that she voted against legislation in 2010 that would have protected small businesses from losing their health plans' grandfathered status under ObamaCare.

You see, the problem with not being able to admit mistakes, whether you are the President or Mary Landrieu, comes when we make a serious one because we don't learn from it, and we're likely to make the same mistake over and over again. Making mistakes is not altogether dishonorable, or even embarrassing. In fact, Thomas Watson, the founder of IBM, believed in building a culture that embraced failure. In fact, one of Watson's most famous quotes is, "The way to succeed is to double your error rate."



I'm not a critic of President Obama because of mistakes he's made. I'm a critic because he hasn't admitted them, learned from them, nor corrected them. He's stayed the proverbial "course" on Obamacare, despite overwhelming evidence to the contrary, and to the displeasure of millions of Americans. As one of our founding fathers once said, "A body of men holding themselves accountable to nobody ought not to be trusted by anybody."

At least if you are rear-ended on Youree Drive, emergency responders will be on the way to make the situation better. The question now, based on the President's "apology", is who has the courage in Washington to admit their mistakes, and answer the American people's 911 call for help?
