





## New Shreveport City Council Convenes and Begins Work with New Mayor

### THIS MONTH'S MEETING

Speaker for this month's luncheon at **12 noon on Tuesday, February 6, 2015** at the Wyndam Garden Hotel (formerly the Clarion Hotel) on E. 70th Street will be **new City Councilman James Flurry** and **veteran City Councilman Michael Corbin**.

There are a number of issues before Shreveport City Council in 2015, not to mention beginning a relationship with a new Mayor and a new CAO. There is also a plan to invest at least \$21 million in Shreveport's streets throughout 2015.



The directors of the Public Works and City Engineering Departments will make their recommendations to the city council for the prioritization of streets because there is a backlog of \$400 million of repairs that are needed throughout the city.



Shreveport is also preparing to issue approximately \$75 million in water/sewer revenue bonds as well as some \$90 million in general obligation bonds, and as well as consider new economic development opportunities.

Reservations not required. Eating is \$13, no cost to just listen, and free parking.

## FROM THE CHAIRMAN

There are a number of important races this year, as well as a number of initiatives to raise our taxes. ## RETURN RETIREMENT MONEY?

There's an allegation that the Caddo Parish Commission created and unanimously voted themselves into "CPERS," the Caddo Parish Employees Retirement System in 2000, which was unconstitutional then, and continues to be unconstitutional now. In a report from Elliott Stonecipher, he alleges that the

intent of Governor Foster, the legislature and Louisiana (and Caddo) voters was to establish that "... part-time positions should not be considered a career, but a public service; retirement is an expensive benefit which may be abused by part-time officials..."

## HOW WELL DID THE GOP DO?

As most know, we picked up 9 U.S. Senate seats for a 54-46 majority. In doing this, Republicans defeated 5 incumbent Democrats, picked up open seats in 4 states and successfully defended 3 compleutive seats in Georgia, Kansas and Kentucky. In the House, Republicans picked up 13 previously Democrat-held seats giving Republicans a 247 seat majority having picked up seats in every region of the country. Governors: There are now 31 Republican governors out of the 50, having re-elected 8 in states that Obama won twice. Republicans picked up the governorship in Arkansas as well as 3 of the bluest states in the union (Illinois, Maryland and Massachusetts). State Houses and Senate Makeup: Republicans went from controlling 60 of 99 state legislative chambers to controlling 69 – an all time high for the Party.


## JUSTICE VICTORY WINS AWARDS
